Health Insurance



The Maryland health insurance open enrollment period is happening now through the state's official health insurance marketplace. Shop for a plan and enroll. The deadline is **Tuesday, December 15**. To sign up:

NEW: COVID Prevention Hotline

The Maryland State Police is expanding its 24/7 COVID-19 Prevention Hotline, where members of the public can report unsafe facilities and activities or public health order violations. NEW: MarylandMedNow Job Opportunities

A partnership with the Maryland Department of Health and the Maryland Hospital Association, MarylandMedNow has been launched to recruit Maryland job seekers with clinical backgrounds to assist with screening, testing, treatment and healthcare delivery at state hospitals, nursing homes, testing sites, and vaccination clinics. [Maryland Assisted Housing Relief Program](#)

UPDATED: The Assisted Housing Relief Program is intended to help bring rental delinquencies current for rentals in multi-family projects financed by the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development and provide relief for the tenants affected by the COVID-19 pandemic through direct payments to the eligible property management company. Tenants in eligible properties will be credited with up to a nine-month rent rebate. Eligibility requirements and a [property lookup](#) feature are included on the website. The deadline is **December 18**.
